

Moravian Holy Land Tour Suggestions for Things to Bring with You

- ...clothing that keeps you cool in the desert heat and yet have options to cover your shoulders and knees—some religious sites have strict dress codes—comfortable walking shoes, umbrella, hat/cap/sun visor, sunglasses, sunscreen, lip balm.
- ...bring along **face masks** and **proof of vaccination** in case they are required at any point along our journey.
- ...avoid tools with sharp edges; and do not accept items or packages from people you do not know for transport in or out of Tel Aviv airport.
- ...carry electronic items in your hand luggage for safety and security.
- ...consider disabling internet access on your smart devices until you are in locations that offer free WiFi. Check with your mobile phone service provider regarding roaming charges.
- ...follow TSA guidelines for a list of what is allowed in carry-on luggage.
{3-1-1 for carry-ons ⇔ 3-ounces or smaller containers of liquid or gel, in 1 quart-size clear plastic zip-top bag, 1 bag per traveler placed in the security bin.}
- ...in bringing cash, consider including smaller denominations to enable you to make purchases with exact change at some locations.
- ...for the visit to the Dead Sea, you may wish to bring swimwear, water shoes, and towel.
- ...consider leaving room in your luggage for purchases along the way. Also, you may wish to arrange with vendors for purchased items to be shipped directly to your home.
- ...many transatlantic airlines still allow passengers to check one free piece of luggage weighing up to 50 lbs. However, checking a second bag may cost \$100.
